



distance from the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. One of the most scenic ways to travel to the Kitsap Peninsula is aboard the world famous WA State Ferries. (See ferries shown on the map.) Four routes serve the Kitsap Peninsula: Edmonds-Kingston,

Seattle-Bainbridge Island, Seattle-Bremerton and West Seattle-Vashon-Southworth. You can find schedules and other information at wsdot.com/ferries/schedule. If arriving from the south, you'll find access

via the impressive Tacoma Narrows Bridge and Hwy 16, or Hwy 3 via Olympia-Shelton. If arriving from Canada via the Blackball or Victoria Ferry to Port Angeles, or from the Olympic Peninsula, your route is via Hwy 104



across the Hood Canal Bridge. The Bremerton National Airport serves those arriving by private plane. Visit the links above for other transportation options and visitor services.


Conference & Meeting Places



recognized by the US Lighthouse Society, the beautifully restored 1879 Point No Point Lighthouse is a must-see. The multi-bedroom keeper's house is available to rent. Nearby is the pet-friendly Point No Point Park with picnic areas, wetland trails and official WA State Audubon birding sites. Quench your thirst and appetite at the HansGrill, a local favorite cafe and grocery store where you can fuel up or pack a picnic for a stroll around Kitsap County's Buck Lake, Hansville Greenway Nature Preserve or Norwegian Point Park.

Little Boston/Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe

VisitKitsap.com/Little-Boston Descendants of the Salish people, the Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe has lived on the shores



for more than 1,000 years. Today, the Tribe continues the traditions that shaped its culture, including the annual ancestral canoe journey. One of the Tribe's most popular visitor attractions is Heronswood, an internationally renowned garden open Fridays and Saturdays for scheduled tours, lectures and rare plant sales. The Point Casino & Hotel offers live entertainment and a variety of dining options featuring Fresh Market menus.

Port Gamble

VisitKitsap.com/Port-Gamble This once-mighty mill town hasn't changed much since the 1850s. Today it's an official National Historic Site where original Victorian homes are still in use as residences, shops and lodging at the The Port Gamble Guest Houses

The historic Port Gamble Theater, museum, and post office are still in use today. The old Port Gamble General Store is home to a massive seashell museum and at St. Paul's Church, shown above, couples have been saying "I do" since 1897. Outdoor recreation fans will enjoy miles of hiking and mountain bike trails and kayak rentals.

Kingston & Washington State Ferry Kitsap Transit Fast Ferry Terminals VisitKitsap.com/Kingsto

Once a rip-roaring lumber town, Kingston is now a cozy waterfront community that welcomes visitors to shop,eat, drink and enjoy events. The Port of Kingston Marina and Mike Wallace

Waterfront Park host the Kingston Sunday Public Market, summer Concerts on Apple Tree Cove, Kites Over Kingston (March) and many other events. The Kingston Chamber of Commerce & Visitor Information Center is a great place to finds info about the Kitsap Peninsula region. Kingston is served by the Edmonds-Kingston WA State Ferry route and Kitsap Transit Passenger Fast Ferry. Details at VisitKitsap.com/ferries.

Indianola VisitKitsap.com/Indianola

This close-knit community is centered around a long public waterfront pier that juts into Puget Sound with spectacular views across to Seattle.

Poulsbo-Little Norway VisitKitsap.com/Poulsbo

Norwegian loggers, farmers and fishermen who arrived in 1885 loved the area so much they named it Little Norway. Start your tour at the Poulsbo Maritime Museum and Visitor Center and head down Front Street to indulge

in pastries from the world famous Sluys Bakery, handmade treats from Boehm's Chocolates, and marvel at the largest collection of licorice in the USA at Marina Market. Art galleries, boutiques, antique and specialty shops, indie bookstores and dozens of eateries will keep you entertained for most of the day. Poulsbo is a great place to enjoy outdoor recreation, including cycling and kayaking. Wrap up the day with a cold one at Poulsbo's award-winning microbreweries. Key Events: Poulsbo Viking Fest (mid-May), July 3 Fireworks, Arts & Craft Festival, and Concerts on the Bay. Stay the night or weekend and get to know this lovely gem on the Kitsap Peninsula.

Suquamish/Suquamish Tribe /isitKitsap.com/Suguamish This scenic waterfront community is the



Located between Silverdale and Poulsbo, Keyport is home to the Naval Undersea Museum, a favorite of nautical buffs and children of all ages. The Port of Keyport & Marina has

a boat launch, public beach and dock with tables located steps from the Keyport Mercantile & Diner, which offers homemade sandwiches and hand-dipped ice cream. It's a great place to get picnic supplies or launch your Kitsap Peninsula National Water Trail adventure.

Silverdale

VisitKitsap.com/Silverdale Silverdale is the largest retail hub in the region and offers visitors the unique opportunity to enjoy both a great shopping and outdoor recreation experience. The Best Western Plus Silverdale Beach Hotel and Oxford Suites

overlook the waterfront minutes from the Kitsap Mall, The Trails, famous retailers REI, Costco and Trader Joe's and five very impressive golf courses. There are a variety of dining choices for all tastes and ages. Silverdale is very child and pet friendly, so take time to discover its "natural side" in Old Town Silverdale and Silverdale Waterfront Park, including the large playground, walkable beach, restrooms and picnic areas. The 7 mile Clear Creek Trail offers family friendlytrails, views of wildlife habitat and WA State Audubon birding sites. The Port of Silverdale offers boat launches, public piers, overnight moorage, kayak/SUP rentals and the perfect place to launch your Kitsap Peninsula National Water Trail adventures.

Seabeck

VisitKitsap.com/Seabeck Just minutes from Silverdale, this once booming mill town is now a nice stop to add to your visit to the Kitsap Peninsula. The historic Seabeck General Store is a great place to pick up picnic provisions and enjoy a stroll

on the public dock. Guillemot Cove Nature Reserve offers access to saltwater beaches, trails and wildlife viewing. Scenic Beach State Park offers camping, picnic areas and trails. Great destination for cycling, kayaking and scenic drives with spectacular views of Hood Canal and the Olympic Mountains.

Bremerton & WA State Ferry **Kitsap Transit Fast Ferry Terminals** VisitKitsap.com/Bremerton

Bremerton is the largest city in the region famous for its historic Naval and maritime heritage. Popular attractions include the historic USS Turner Joy, Puget Sound Naval

Museum, Naval Shipyard Memorial Fountain Plaza, Kitsap Historical Museum, and Aurora Valentinetti Puppet Museum. Hop aboard the Kitsap Transit foot ferry for 10-minute journey that connects Bremerton and Port Orchard waterfront. Popular annual events include WA State Bremerton Brewfest (mid July) and the Blackberry Festival (early Sept). Bremerton is served by the Seattle-Bremerton WA State Ferry route and Kitsap Transit Passenger Fast Ferry. Details at VisitKitsap.com/ferries.

Port Orchard

VisitKitsap.com/Port-Orchard This scenic waterfront town is a haven of large and small antique stores, specialty shops offering re-purposed items, and eateries to satisfy any taste buds. There are dozens of

gifts to give and get. The passenger terminal for the foot ferry and Port Orchard Marina are located on the boardwalk leading to the Port Orchard waterfront park, children's playground and walking trail. During the summer, the waterfront park hosts the Port Orchard Farmers Market, Car Cruz, Taste of Port Orchard, Saturday Night Market, and free summer Concerts on the Bay. Other attractions include the Veteran's Museum and Sidney Museum & Art Gallery.

Annapolis, Manchester, Southworth and Olalla VisitKitsap.com/places-to-go

One of the most scenic car and cycling routes on the Kitsap Peninsula is

Located south of Bremerton is **Belfair**. It is the place to begin exploring the Hood Canal area, a popular destination for outdoor recreation activities like boating, fishing, cycling, kayaking and camping at Belfair and Twanoh State Parks. Heading south is the little waterfront town of **Allyn**, a classic tourist stop with great burgers, ice cream, local diner and beach perfect for a picnic.

Gig Harbor VisitKitsap.com/Gig-harbor

Located just across the Tacoma Narrows Bridge, this sophisticated city is a great place to launch your Kitsap Peninsula journey. The historic waterfront district is lined with art galleries, shops and dozens of great dining choices. Attractions include the Harbor History Museum, Waterfront History Walk and Narrows Park. Gig Harbor is part of the Kitsap Peninsula National Water Trails and offers many places to launch a kayak, SUP, and enoy other boating and recreation activities.



ancestral home of the Suquamish Tribe and an internationally recognized center of Native American history, culture, art and events. Tribal landmarks include the world-class Suguamish

Museum, restored Chief Seattle Grave site, Suquamish Veteran's Memorial, and massive House of Awakened Culture, fashioned after the original 900-foot-long Old Man House. The public dock and picnic areas offer stunning views of the mountains, Salish Sea and Seattle. The Suquamish Clearwater Casino Resort and 184-room hotel is located just off the main highway.

the shoreline from downtown Port Orchard heading east along Bay St. past the Comfort Inn on the Bay and all the way to Olalla. The nearest rest-stop is at **Annapolis** home of locally-owned Whiskey Gulch Coffee Co. & Café. Next is the **Manchester** with a lovely public park, picnic tables, and sandy beach. Port of Manchester's public dock is perfect to launch a motor or non-motorized water craft. Nearby is Manchester State Park offering trails, beach access and overnight camping. Other stops along the way include the Harper Pier & Estuary and the WA State Southworth Ferry Terminal that sails between Southworth in South Kitsap, West Seattle, and Vashon Island. Continue south
